We talked about what a predication was as well as what hypothesis means. All we needed for the experiment were a few ingredients. We used hot water, oil, vinegar and seltzer as our potential solvents. We placed candy corns in each of the solvents and started the timer. We then observed what happened to the candy corns. The children predicted the candy corn would move up and down. What really happened was the waxy layer on the surface of the candy pulled away first and then melted away while using the hot water the fastest. Ask your child about it. It was Super cool!!!
